"Can I help you?" We often hear or even say those words to someone. Those are the words that I was taught to say when I worked in the hardware store in High School. Sometimes it gets changed up a little, "What can I do for you?" Either way, it is an opportunity for us to ask for what we need. Nehemiah knew what was needed to build the wall, and before he asked the King for the list, he shot an arrow prayer to God asking for support. Nehemiah 2:4 gives us the response to the King's question: "So I prayed to the God of the Heavens, and answered the King." We are not told what he prayed, just that he shot this prayer to God and kept right on going with his conversation.

Prayer is intended to be a day-long conversation with our God. We may have intentional times set aside to be in prayer, but because we have a relationship with the God of heaven, we can and should shoot a prayer to him at any time. We should not be afraid to ask anything of God when we live in a constant relationship with him. When we live apart from him, our prayers become self-focused and we may become self-conscious about a conversation with God.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 records this quick little reminder to us about our prayer life: 16 Rejoice always, 17 pray without ceasing, 18 give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.
